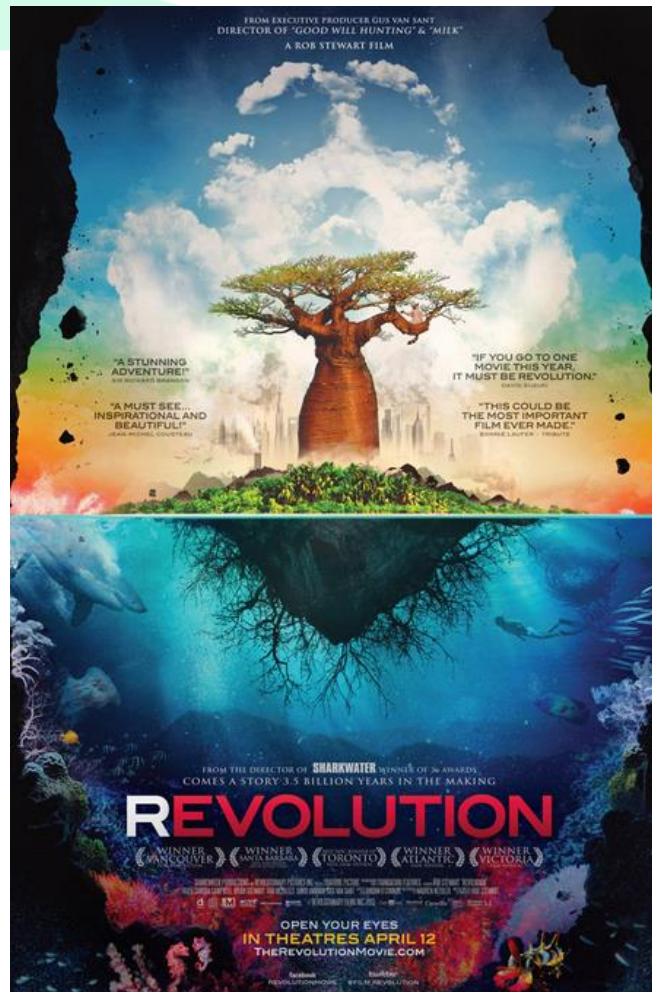
How to win:
